Other details of the programme	<p>The aims of the Dental Hygiene Programme are the following: 1) to educate and train dental hygienists meeting the requirements recognized in the European Union; 2) to create possibilities for acquiring the qualification of an dental hygienist, granting the right to provide healthcare services; 3) to develop a personality capable of understanding and accepting changes in the society, and capable of functioning in a democratic society; 4) to foster interest in the novelties of the science and practice of oral health care; 5) to develop creative, scientific, and critical thinking, and the sense of intellectual satisfaction from studies or work; and 6) to develop the ability to retain sufficient professional competence throughout the life-long learning period. These aims of the Dental Hygiene Programme are directly related to the mission of the Programme – to educate and train dental hygienists who could cooperate with other health care specialists for ensuring individual and public health.
